




### IGAD At a Glance as of Apr 2025






### Major Situations in IGAD as of April 2025





### Breakdown of Urban Location REF/ASY by Country of Asylum




#### Breakdown of Population by Accommodation Type



### **GRF 2023**

Eight host governments from the region announced **34 transformational pledges.** 

**250 pledges** were made by other entities in support of these host governments' policy pledges, the majority targeting Ethiopia, Kenya & Uganda.

At least **42 pledges** included a financial commitment targeting one or more countries in the region – equivalent to some **USD 468 million** over the next four years.

### Defining Climate Resilient and Sustainable Human Settlements

Climate Resilient and Sustainable Human Settlements refer to urban and rural areas that are designed, developed, and managed in ways that integrate climate adaptation, environmental sustainability, social equity, and community participation in the planning and development of urban and rural areas.

This approach seeks to create **livable**, **safe**, and **environmentally responsible communities** that can **withstand the challenges of climate change** while improving the quality of life for both forcibly displaced populations and hosting communities.

It also emphasizes the transition from temporary or formal camps to more **sustainable**, **integrated forms of settlement**, such as **municipalities** or **planned urban areas**, fostering long-term resilience and community cohesion.


